from Nov. Eager Beaver--Hams Respond to Emergency Call

(2) Thursday evening, Sept. 17, *Hal, KC7ZZB* checked in about 5:30pm on the Oregon ARES Net, and asked for help. Hal and his family had been boating in eastern Oregon on the Powder River. They were using a 20 foot pontoon boat; the engine had failed and they were adrift. Hal requested a phone call to the Baker County Sheriff for help. Ernie, K7EAJ, made the call. Claire, N7CM, stayed on the air to relay the Sheriff's questions to Hal. The sheriff wanted to know Hal's approximate location, and the number and ages of passengers.....(there were 7 of Hal's family on the boat, ranging in age from 85 to 19). Maintaining power supply to his radio was a big issue for Hal, and he made his transmissions brief to conserve power.

The Baker County Sheriff estimated that it would take nearly an hour to get help out there to Hal. Ernie and Claire and a group of hams stayed on the air with Hal: W7TDN, Trent in Polk County, also Ken, KD7BUJ, Polk County, and Larry, N6TW, Marion County, also Dick, K7DDI in Klamath County, and probably many others who were listening....

From time to time, the Sheriff phoned here in Hillsboro with questions about Hal's situation. Ernie queried Hal via radio, then phoned the Sheriff back with the answers. As time went by, Hal's boat drifted into the Snake River, and since the wind was strong, his boat was actually drifting against the current.

At one point, another boat passed them and Hal's group all waved frantically, even fired off a flare, but the boat did not stop.

As it got darker here in Washington County, the 'skip' came up and began to interfere with Hal's transmissions. Trent and Ken sought another quieter frequency and we all moved up to a frequency where a couple of California hams happened to be having a QSO. K1BMW, Bill, in Truckee, CA; and WD6FGB, Van, also in CA allowed us to break in and joined us, offering to stand by to relay if needed.

Before total darkness, Hal reported what landmarks he could see from his location to Ernie; he phoned the Sheriff again with that information. The Sheriff said they were about to put into the water, and requested a description of the boat. Hal's radio was getting weaker, but with relays, we were able to receive the information and pass it to the Sheriff. At just about 7:15, we copied a weak signal from Hal that he could see a boat approaching. And shortly after, another happy shout from Hal that the Sheriff was there! We believe that there was a unheard group sigh of relief from those who were listening! (and surely a group shout of thanks from those being rescued....)

There is a significant learning point in this event: Success did not happen randomly: Successful rescue in this case "happened" because Hal was prepared with radio, antennas; he knew schedules and procedures. Hal knew the OARES net schedule, as well as the frequency, and the time that local hams would be on the air and able to hear and help him. Hal also knew his equipment and how to pace it to make his power last. And he provided pertinent information to relay to the rescuers, and at the critical time, also provided landmarks. We have heard some ham friends say that they consider the idea of regularly checking into nets as a waste of time.....but, in this case, there is no doubt about how useful familiarity with daily nets can be when one needs assistance (tnx to Claire, N7CM, and "The Eager Beaver" for sharing this with us. Ed.)
