I was told by several sources that Phil wrote his own obituary, which appeared in the Klamath Falls paper. (ed)

MORE ON W7BW BY PURK PURKLHISER, K7JIX: On our regular Klamath Basin Repeater Association meeting, (KBRA) following the passing away of Phil Rand, W7BW, I made the statement that I was one of the remaining few that watched Phil fly P 38' fighter planes in 1944.

Fred, ND7V, the NETTER editor called and ask if I could elaborate a little on this and he would put it in the NETTER.

Well, I was assigned to a Navy amphibious unit, we were stationed in the Solomon Islands Group. We were getting ready for what ever we were going to do. (We did it) The air strip was located about a mile away from our base and every chance that I got I would go over and watch the P 38's fly. That was several times a week.

Well, about 20 some years later I am working in Klamath Falls. I had been a ham (K7JIX) for about 5 years when I met Phil Rand, W7BW at some ham event. We talked about ham things, etc. We talked a lot about CW. Anyway I ask him if he had ever flown P 38's, and of course he had. I told him I used to like to watch them fly. He ask where was that, I told him the Solomon

(2) Islands. He ask when, I told him in the spring and summer of 1944. He ask which island I was on, I told him the Russell Group on the island of Mbaniki. (ba-neek-a) He said undoubtedly I must have watched him fly because he was stationed there at the time. We talked about it several times after that. (Thank you Purk for that most interesting story about Phil) (ed)

It is with great regret that I have to let everyone know of the passing of Phil Rand W7BW of Klamath Falls, Or. Phil was always a friend and mentor.

He was in Hospice care for about 6 months but still managed to make at least one CW and one PSK contact everyday. His voice was giving away so he used these modes at the end. Phil loved AM and operated that mode when ever he had the opportunity. He was a real ham and we both enjoyed the hobby to the fullest.

Phil was an honest hero and National treasure. He flew combat in fighters during three wars. Born in 1923 he was just a kid when he entered the war. He become a fighter pilot and spent his time in the South Pacific where he was once shot down. He was found, picked up, and went right back into combat.

Later in Vietnam he flew combat. His A4 was hit with a SAM during a ground support operation but he managed to eject. The ejection was not pretty and suffered many injuries to his face and a compressed spine. He ended up on the wrong side and had to shoot his way out to an Evac chopper. He was patched up and went home R&R to see his wife Alice in San Francisco. The first night there they went to a nice restaurant for dinner. He wore his dress uniform which his wife had told him was probably a good idea. On arrival he was spit on while waiting for a table. The person who did that may still be alive because Phil shrugged it off and went about his business of having dinner with his wire. Phil retired a Colonel in the Air Force. An unassuming guy who just did his job.

After his passing he is still serving our country. His family is one of heros. Most of his children and some grandchildren have served in the military including some more pilots. After Phil's wife passed he remarried later. Judy made his life wonderful in his late years. He said so many times how lucky he had been all his life. Judy is a hero too for taking great care of one of our finest.

I was privileged and honored this man called me friend. To say he will be missed is ridiculous. We will hurt. I miss working him on 10 meter AM when the band favored us, and I miss our telephone conversations. 73 K0AZ Mike Sanders (Thanks Mike for that great story about Phil, we will all miss him.) (ed)

JUST GOOD CHOW by Connie, N7RBH: QUICK PEACH CRISP Take ten fresh peaches peeled, and sliced . One cup sugar. ¼ teaspoon of salt. One cup sifted flour. ½ teaspoon of cinnamon. ½ cup of butter, softened. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Arrange peach sliced in a buttered 8 inch square baking dish. In a bowl, combine sugar, salt, flower and cinnamon. Cut in softened butter until mixture resembles coarse meal. Sprinkle flower mixture evenly over peaches. Bake 40 minutes or until peaches are tender and topping is golden. Serves 4 to 6 people. Better with ice cream on top.
